Connecting Cambridgeshire is a partnership programme hosted by Cambridgeshire County Council and led by Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority, working with local councils and government to improve broadband, mobile and public access Wi-Fi across the county. We're helping to make Cambridgeshire and Peterborough one of the best-connected regions in the UK.

But digital inclusion is about more than just infrastructure. That's why we're also focused on making sure everyone – regardless of age, income or ability – can access the digital tools, skills and support they need to thrive in a digital world.

Supporting Digital Inclusion Across the County

We work with local partners and community organisations to help residents get online and stay connected. Our support includes:

- Digital Hubs We've launched a countywide network of Digital Hubs, based in trusted community spaces, where residents can access free Wi-Fi, use devices, and get friendly help from trained Digital Champions. - Free Public Wi-Fi (CambWifi) We've rolled out secure, easy-to-use CambWifi in libraries, market towns and public buildings. It's free for everyone - no data plan needed.
